

The newly launched Deutsche Schule Chennai at Neelankarai in the city, one of its kind schools in the country has decided to recruit a teacher to impart Tamil as a language, apart from German and English, facilitating students

from the city to learn Tamil also.

Speaking to Deccan Chronicle Education, Mr. Thomas A. Pallushek, principal of the school said that the school follows Bavarian curriculum that is known for the highest German educational standard. "Even though we teach German and English we have planned to recruit a Tamil teacher, who will shortly be joining us. The school, offers special courses like music, art, theatre, sport, public-speaking, etc. The school has now started admitting students for nursery and pre-school. A parent has to pay 100 Euros as application fee, apart from 260 Euros for nursery school and 540 Euros for pre-school as fee per month". As a gesture of charity the school will admit every tenth child from an unprivileged section of the society and provide free education. The first 10 children who join the school will get 50 per cent waiver on fees. The school also welcomes parents to send their kids to the school free of charge for one day.
